Bob White was another to win the county championship and the 4th in 6 championship matches to take the title as he decisioned Overmiller of Suitland 4-3 in the 133-pound class.



The first annual Capital Tri-County wrestling tournament was held over the past weekend, 21-22, at Glen Burnie High School.


Twenty-two schools participated in this tournament as they represented three counties.

Recognition of charter mempers of the Chamber will be leatured on the program.






