Of Wrestling




George Wills has participat. ed on the Laurel High wrestling team for four years and has received a letter for three of the four years.



Defending Prince Georges and Tri - County wrestling champion Laurel has met and conquered Du-Val, the team considered to be its biggest obstacle on the way to a second consecutive undefeated season. The Tigers' tails were twisted last Thursday, 29-16, as they were left only with the distinction of holding Laurel to its closest match of the year, if that is what a 13point difference can be labeled.

It could have been much worse for the Tigers. Previous recipients of sound thrashings by Laurel this season in this gentlemen's form of the ancient art of wrestling, which is mushrooming in popularity here, were not quite as lucky. Severna Park, defending Anne Arundel champ, was dealt a resounding 34-14 thumping; Northwestern succumbed, 34-13, and Glen Burnie was bombed, 35-14, before Laurel exploded with 45-3 and 46-6 attacks against Surrattsville and High Point, respectively.

Laurel's three - year wrestling manager, Tony West, who doubles as the team's publicity man, says the DuVal win stretched Laurel's undefeated dual meet string to 14, dating back to the final match of the 1962-63 campaign. Included in the total is a 23-23 stand-off with Glen Burnie in the opener last season.

Scores up to now indicate Laurel has a powerhouse line-up all the way along the 12 weight classes which make up the team — ranging from the lightest weight class; 95 pounds, through the heavyweight division. Statistician West turned to his books to pinpoint his top matmen, and impressive their records are. There are four headliners, starting with co-captain Melvin Baird, who holds down the 105-pound starting borth and has registered six pins in six matches this year. He has moved up from the 95-pound class where he was County champ and Tri-County runner-up in 1964.

Also undefeated are 133-pounder George Wills, who last season took the County 127-pound title and placed fourth in Tri-County competition, and Mike Grace, who holds down the 180-pound slot. Grace came in second in the County tournament and is now off to a 5-0 start which includes four pins.

Heavyweight James Daucher, the other co-captain, is now 5-1 after losing to his DuVal opponent by one point. His five victories came via the pin route.

Coach Patrick Réilly, a produci of East Stroudsburg College in Pennsylvania, our neighbor State which produces more than its share of top-flight collegiate wrestlers, has yet to experience defeat in his two-year term at Laurel. It is expected his charges will coast through their three remaining matches and again figure prominently in the competition in the County and Tri-County tournaments.






The three-day tourney features the top four wrestlers in each weight class from last week's Prince Georges, Montgomery and Ann Arundel county tournaments.
