Parkdale wrestlers win title

Parkdale High School captured three individual titles and the team championship last night as Washington suburban schools dominated the fourth annual Maryland Public Secondary Schools Athletic Association wrestling championship tournament at Catonsville Community College.

Only victories by Steve Hoff of Westminster in the 138-pound class and Paul Glamp of North Harford in the unlimited saved some spoils for Baltimore area schools.

Otherwise, schools from Prince Georges and Montgomery counties were in command, taking 10 of the 12 individual championship titles.

Baltimore county, which accounted for four crowns last year, was shut out, although four county wrestlers reached last night's finals.

Tom DiCarlo of Overlea, who won the state's 126-pound title last year, lost the 132 pound final, 1-0, in the last 30 seconds to Craig March of Paint Branch. It was DiCarlo's first loss of the season.

Dennis Treulieb of Sparrows Point also lost his only bout of the season at 98 pounds, bowing out to Mike Walsh of Parkdale on a pin in 2.36.

Surprise finalists

Terry Caudell of Dulaney and Phil Howe of Catonsville, both surprise finalists from the county, lost at 138 and 155, respectively.

Bill Reagan, 112, and Randolph Scott, 167, also won for Parkdale, which accumulated 42 points for the so-called team championship. No team had a full complement of wrestlers competing.

Westminster, with Hoff's championship and runner-up finishes by Chris Daigle at 167 and Ted Daigle at 185, was second to the Prince Georges county school with 32 points. Catonsville tied for sixth, while Overlea, runner-up last year, was eighth and Bel Air, the defending champion, tied for ninth.

An overflow crowd of 3,000 watched the fast-moving finals.

Five wrestlers from Baltimore county won consolation titles: Ted Ensor of Hereford, 98-pound class; Mark Derbyshire, Towson, 132; Tom Peterson, Overlea, 145; Dave Reamer, Pikesville, 167, and Dave Carlisle, Catonsville, unlimited.

Reamer, a county and regional champion, was undefeated going into yesterday afternoon's semi-finals where he lost a 5-to-4 decision to Chris Daigle of Westminster.

Ensor, a freshman, has a highly promising wrestling career ahead of him.

He was runner-up to Sparrow's Point's Treulish in the county and regional championships and finished the season with a 13-3 record.
