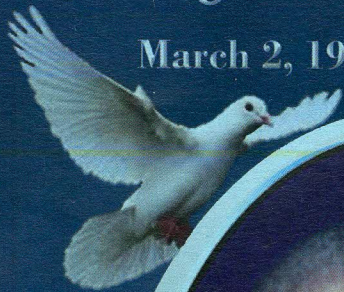

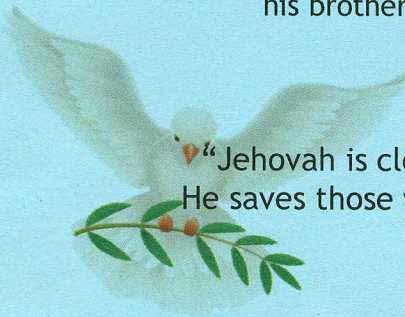

George attended Prince George’s County Public Schools. He graduated from Laurel HS where he was very active in band, football, and wrestling. He attended college and served in the military.

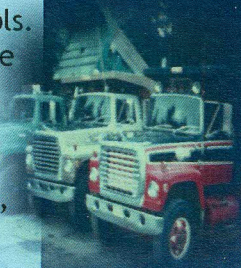
George had a great passion for airplanes, motorcycles, cooking, fishing, photography, traveling, music, and trucks; his life’s business.

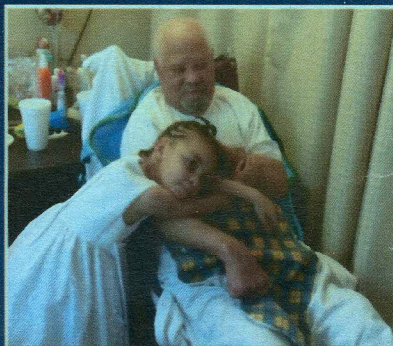
