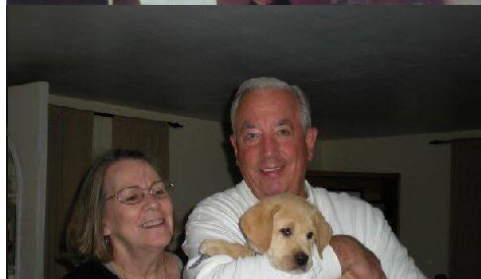
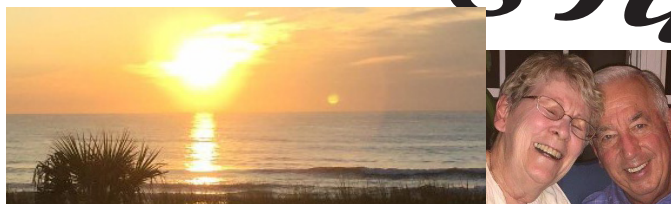


Remembering Jane

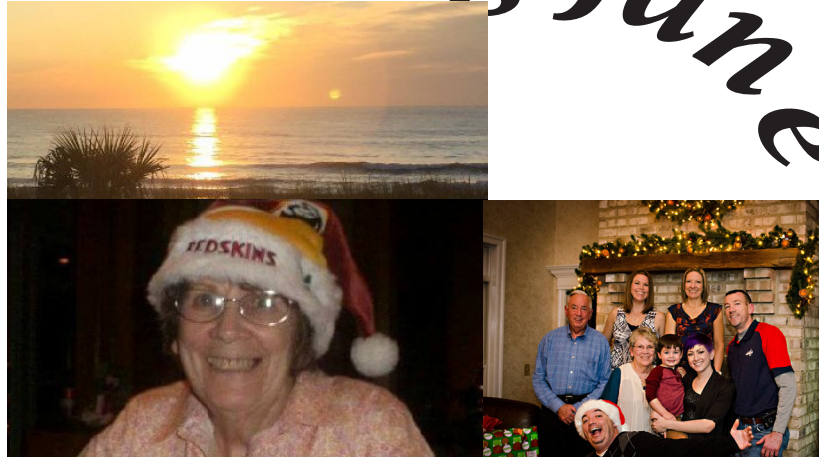
